Overview of Show

The Brisbane Rotary Art Show is re-imagining 40 years of Art Exhibitions held by Brisbane Rotary Clubs. Like the previous highly successful shows, the 2023 event will be held in the foyer of Central Plaza One in Brisbane.

The objective of the Brisbane Rotary Art Show is to provide an opportunity for local and interstate artists to present their work in a central city environment. The venue, the foyer of the prestigious Central Plaza One building, is a significant CBD landmark on the corner of Queen and Creek Streets, Brisbane.

The Show will provide sponsors with an opportunity to associate with a high-profile event while also contributing to programs and projects that make a difference to the lives of people in our communities.

The art works to be included in the exhibition will be from a range of talented contemporary and emerging artists. A wide range of art forms will be represented in the show. Our Art Curator is engaging with a wide variety of artists to ensure the works are both unique and exciting.

Over the four nights of the show, major sponsors of the event will have the opportunity to hold a “Client Cocktail” event at their expense for their own marketing purposes while also allowing their clients to view and purchase the art on display.

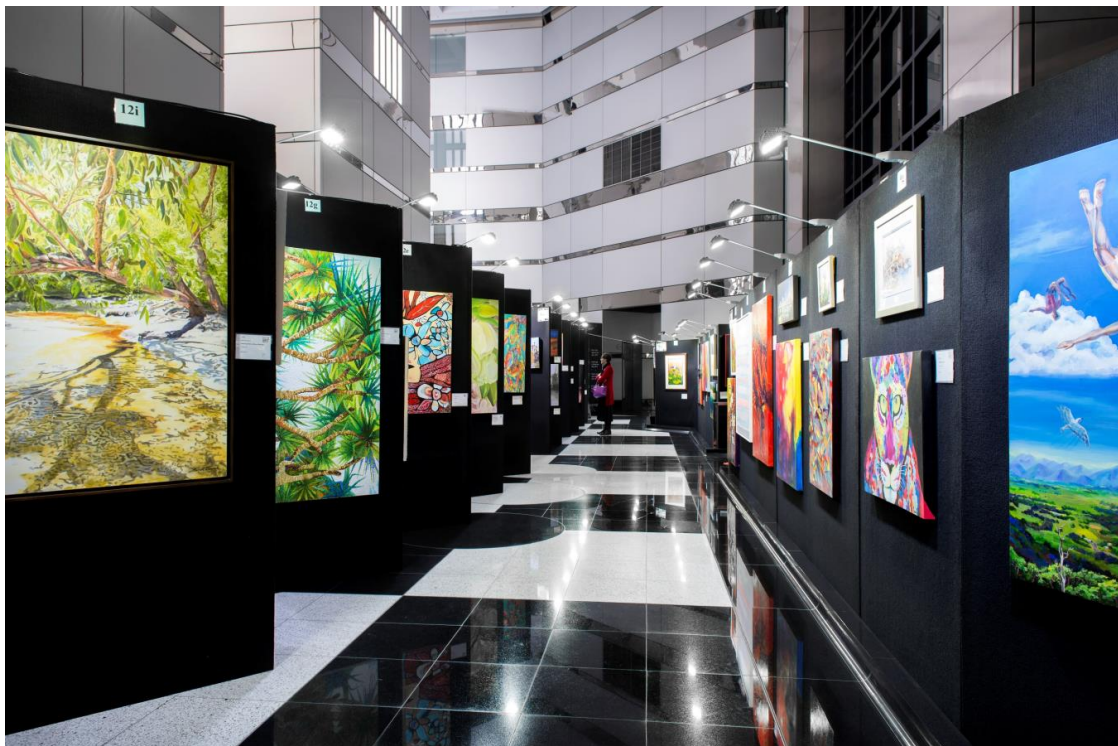


Art Show Market

About the Rotary Clubs

Rotary Clubs exist for the development of service through community and international projects simply to enhance and improve people's lives and their communities. The three Rotary clubs involved in staging this Art Show have impressive records of community and development service, including very strong commitments to youth through support for the many Youth programs offered by Rotary. Below is a summary of current commitments:

The membership of Rotary clubs is comprised of people who endeavour to follow "Service above Self", encouraging the promotion of high ethical standards in business and the professions being one of the primary objectives of all Rotary clubs.

In addition to the targeted recipients of the Art Show success, the following are just a few community projects recently completed or in progress by these three Rotary clubs:

- Disaster relief grants for Ukrainians settled in Australia, and aid to the civilian population in Ukraine.
- Support of Rotary disaster relief grants for flood victims within Australia.
- Ride West, a biennial bike ride from Brisbane to Longreach raising money for mental health support programs for regional Queenslanders.
- Support for the Royal Flying Doctor Service
- Support for Breast Cancer programs
- Support for domestic violence shelters/refuges and DV Safe Phones.
- Youth programs in SE Queensland focused on engaging and promoting young people with our communities, i.e. National Youth Science Forum.

Through Rotary International and the Rotary Foundation, and Rotary clubs around the world, the most significant single project worldwide has been the provision of funding and volunteers to eradicate polio myelitis. In the late 1980's there were typically 350,000 new cases of polio each year around the world. Now, there are just a few new cases each year in Pakistan and Afghanistan. Partnering with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, other philanthropic bodies and the United Nations, this is an effort to eradicate a disease!

Other great work making a difference in the lives of people and carried out with funding from the Rotary Foundation and clubs include programs against malaria and other insidious diseases in the countries geographically close to Australia.

The Rotary Foundation also provides funding for Peace Fellowships to allow post-graduate studies in peace and conflict resolution at six universities around the world. The University of Queensland is one of these six institutions.
